


## MAID-RITE

In the early 1920s, butcher Fred Angell created a special cut and grind of meat, then added selected spices, to create a new ground beef sandwich. A delivery man, upon tasting the sandwich, remarked that the sandwich was "made right." The name MAID-RITE, adapted to mean "wholesomeness and pureness," has remained part of the Midwestern business landscape ever since. The MAID-RITE restaurant at the corner of Jefferson and Pasfield in Springfield opened in August 1924. It boasts of being one of the first restaurants to become part of the successful franchise, as well as, being among the first drive-thru restaurant operations in the United States.

Two partners from Quincy opened the restaurant. Within three weeks, one partner sold out and Clyde Holbrook moved in to run the business successfully for 20 years. When the MAID-RITE franchise started in 1926, Mr. Holbrook

converted the


store to the name that has been used ever

In 1970, Clarence Donley purchased the restaurant. At that time there was a small dining room just off of the entrance and several stools at the counter. The original cooker is still being used, as is the frosty mug freezer. The same menu board that Mr. Donley designed is also still being used, only the prices have been changed.
